Proposed Changes to Schedule A and B of the Midwifery Regulation Update

As you are aware the CMM has been working for several years to make changes to the *Midwifery Regulation*, including Schedules A and B. The following information is intended to inform you of the potential timelines of when these changes might be approved and how they will impact you. Please remember that all timelines are subject to change.

1. Final Draft of Regulation Amendments

The Final Draft of the *Regulation* amendment is nearly ready, along with amendments to Schedules A and B. The final draft will be shared with members as soon as it is available, and a Special General Meeting will be called so that members can vote on its approval.

2. <u>Anticipated approval date</u>

CMM is working with Manitoba Health with the goal of having the *Regulation* amendments approved prior to the election on April 19, 2016. However, even if approved by government prior to the election, the changes will likely not come into effect until a later date; likely June 1, 2016 or later. The CMM will continue to keep members informed regarding timeline changes.

3. Education modules related to amendments to Schedules A and B

In order to prescribe and administer drugs and order and interpret tests according to the new Schedules, all members will be required to successfully complete the required education modules and exam. The CMM has been working with a consultant to have these modules developed. Modules will be computer-based, and the exam will be paper-based. We anticipate these modules will be accessible by members at the beginning of March. Costs for taking these modules and exam will be borne by the member.

- The cost for completing the modules and the exam will be \$200/per member. This is set on a cost-recovery basis for development and delivery of the modules and exams.
- The exam will be paper-based. Multiple exam-writing sessions will be arranged at multiple locations around the province. Specific dates and locations TBA.
- Members are allowed three attempts at the written exam. The cost to repeat the exam is \$50. Any member who fails after the third attempt must arrange for additional tutoring through the CMM at their own expense.
- Any member who has not successfully completed the exam at the time the amended schedules come into effect will have restrictions on their registration related to prescribing medications and ordering tests.

Committee Updates

Standards Committee:

The Standards Committee continues to meet monthly and diligently work on review/revision of the following Standards/Guidelines:

- Guideline for Vaginal Birth After One Previous Low Segment Caesarean Section
- Guideline for the Management of the Third Stage of Labour
- Code of Ethics
- Policy on Records and Record Keeping
- Standard on Continuity of Care
- Guideline on Female Genital Cutting (FGC)

Board of Assessors:

The Board of Assessors continues to meet as necessary to review applications for registration. The Committee recently reviewed applicants that had successfully completed The Manitoba IEM Assessment and Gap Training Process. Several candidates have been registered and are now practicing in various Regional Health Authorities throughout Manitoba.

Education Committee:

Bachelor of Midwifery Program:

UCN/UM Partnership – The Registrar has attended meetings regarding the establishment of a joint Bachelor of Midwifery Program to be offered by a partnership between the University College of the North (UCN) and University of Manitoba (UM). News about this proposed program should be available early in the New Year.

Manitoba Gap Training Process for Internationally Educated Midwives (IEMs):

This process offered its first pilot Gap Training program to 6 candidates from October 2014 to April 2015. The Gap Training included a 6-week in-person intensive as well as a 12-week Clinical Placement. Six candidates completed the program and the placements, and passed the Canadian Midwifery Registration Exam in May 2015. The second pilot of the Gap Training Program is currently underway with two candidates participating.

Quality Assurance Committee:

The Quality Assurance Committee presented at this year's CMM AGM, "Myths of Reflective Practice". This workshop was created through a previous survey the Quality Assurance Committee developed. The midwives were guided through a reflective practice exercise.

Perinatal Review Committee:

The PRC Committee met on December 4th to resume its case review on six cases received late in the previous fiscal year and two new case referrals. CMM members are reminded to submit cases to the CMM as they arise.

Kagike Danikobidan Committee:

KD met on December 11th. Of the greatest significance at the moment is providing outreach support to the Aboriginal students in Year 1 of the UCN program. Some Committee members will be doing so in February. The Committee watches with great interest the development and potential of the proposed joint UM/UCN midwifery education program.

The Committee to Select Public Representatives:

The Committee to Select Public Representatives has recently resumed meeting and has had some changes to its membership. The Committee bids farewell to Doris Young, member appointed by the CMM's Kagike Danikobidan Committee. At the same time it welcomes Sandi Howard, RM appointed by Kagike Danikobidan. The Committee also welcomes Lori Peters as a member appointed by the Committee, who has used the services of a midwife, and is not a member of another regulated health profession. Kari Hammersley, RM was appointed by the CMM Governing Council in May of 2015. Trina Larsen, (Appointed by the Women's Health Clinic) has agreed to be Chairperson for this Committee. The Committee has met three times since May 2015, and three applicants have been reviewed and appointed as follows:

- Lori Peters, (Rural) has been appointed to the Governing Council for a 3-year term beginning November 2015 October 2018.
- Susie Penner, (Rural) has been appointed to the Education Committee for a 3-year term beginning October 2015 September 2018.
- Bibiane LaFleche has been appointed to the Standards Committee for a 3-year term beginning September 2015 August 2018.

We wish to acknowledge Doris Young (Kagike Danikobidan Rep) for her time and commitment to this Committee and the Board of Assessors over the years. Her contribution has been valuable.

Canadian Midwifery Regulators Council Update

This year has represented the eighth year that the College of Midwives of Manitoba has had the honor of providing administrative leadership and support as the Secretariat to the CMRC. As the national body that represents midwifery regulatory authorities, the CMRC has a key role in strengthening the practice and regulatory framework of midwifery in Canada as well as supporting a goal of pan-Canadian midwifery regulation. The CMRC is awaiting word on an extensive funding proposal that it has submitted to Employment and Skills Development Canada which would enable the CMRC to continue its work of harmonizing standards in relation to education, assessment and bridging programs. The CMRC continues to provide information and support to provinces and territories not yet regulated most recently Newfoundland and the Yukon.

REMINDERS:

Important update re: Registration Renewal

Every spring the College of Midwives of Manitoba (CMM) looks forward to renewing the membership of our midwives and students for another year. As we approach renewal time please take note of the following important reminders:

- Renewal packages will be sent out via email in early February and all renewal documents must be returned to the CMM by March 1st.
- NEW! All practising midwives must complete their 'Quality Assurance Yearly Record' every year. This form does not have to be submitted with your application, but you must sign the self-declaration of completion that will be included on the Application for Renewal Form to be sent out in February.
- All certifications in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, Neonatal Resuscitation and Emergency Skills must be current as of March 31st. No exceptions. Please plan ahead.
- It is important that you submit a complete application/address the missing items so as avoid penalty fees and possible restrictions on your registrations.



Topic of Interest:

How Peer Case Review is Distinct from Discussion with a Midwife

As per the CMM Standard on Quality Assurance for Midwives "Peer Case Review is an educational forum to discuss and learn from completed midwifery cases and to demonstrate accountability of the midwife to their peers and to CMM Standards." Revisions to the Standard on Quality Assurance for Midwives were circulated in September 2015, and they noted that "Peer Case Review is distinct from midwife to midwife discussions as required by the Standard for Discussion, Consultation and Transfer of Care", and included the following guidelines for conducting a Peer Case Review:

- I. Involve member(s) from at least two (2) practice groups with a minimum of four (4) midwives participating;
- II. Include a presentation of a case history, management and outcome;
- III. Involve a discussion of CMM guidelines, standards and policies and their application to the case;
- IV. Consider observations and comments from the participants.

It is important to note that the *Standard on Quality Assurance for Midwives* highlights its purpose as a forum to discuss completed midwifery cases, and should include a presentation that includes the outcome of the case. Therefore cases where the client is still in care are not well-suited to Peer Case Review.

Cases where the midwife (or practice) is seeking an opinion from another midwife (or practice) while the case is still 'in progress' (i.e. where the client is still in care) are better suited to discussion with another midwife. In such cases the midwife (or practice) should make it clear that they are seeking a discussion with another midwife (or practice) in order to plan care appropriately. The midwife should then document the discussion and the plan for care in the client's chart. The plan for care may include further consultation with other care providers.
